Already. Not Yet.

Advent is a fascinating season. It embraces two themes which seem to contradict one another. We talk about hope, and watching, preparing and anticipation. However, we also talk about the arrival; the one who is in our midst; the kingdom of heaven being near. Even though these may sound contradictory, they are not. They express two very real dynamics in our relationship with Jesus.

Yes, Jesus is in our midst. Yes, we are baptized into Jesus. Yes, Jesus is the Word of God who comes to us in the Scriptures. Yes, it is his body and blood that become one with us in Holy Communion. Yes, Jesus is here.

And yet, we know that there is more to come. There is more to come in this life regarding our experience with Jesus, and we know that the next life promises even more.

So, Advent is not about waiting for a baby to arrive in a faraway stable. And, Advent really isn't about getting house and home ready for the celebration on the 25th. Instead, Advent forces us to ask questions about the arrival of Jesus in our lives today and tomorrow. When do we expect the encounter? How might it come about? What do we expect to happen when it does occur? What are we looking forward to, and why are we looking forward to it?

This year, with Christmas falling on a Sunday, we get four full weeks of Advent. (If Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, we get three weeks and a day.) What we do during Advent needs to last much longer than just these four weeks. We need to do the work of Advent all year long, but Advent is a good discipline for us. By taking this special time now, we intentionally rehearse this work that lasts a lifetime. May the "already" of Christ present with us now help us to anticipate with great hope the joy that is yet to come.


Help \	Nanted_
