The SPARK Story Bible reading for Sunday is found on page 14; "The First Sin" based on the reading from Genesis 3:1-24.

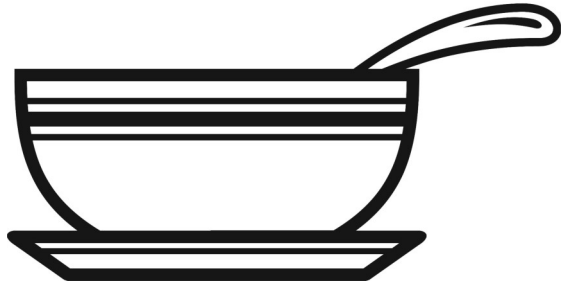
World Hunger Drive!

Turkey and Syria rocked by devastating earthquake.

The violent earthquake and dozens of powerful aftershocks that struck Turkey on February 6 have devastated families. The first was a magnitude 7.8 earthquake in south central Turkey, followed hours later by a magnitude 7.5 quake in the southeastern part of the country. The two quakes have devastated Turkey and Syria, collapsing thousands of buildings and damaging infrastructure. Over 2,000 people have been killed and thousands more have been injured, yet search-and-rescue efforts are only in the early stages.

Survivors of the quakes report that the ground shook so forcefully that it was difficult to stand. Terrified of another strong aftershock, people are remaining outside in freezing temperatures.

A Lutheran World Relief Team is coordinating a response with its network of trusted local partners.

Your gift to our emergency response fund will be a godsend to neighbors affected by the quakes. Right now, the best way to help is to make a donation now to quickly deliver lifesaving aid.
