The flowers for Sunday are given by Roger and Beverly DeGroot and are in memory of Chuck Richards.

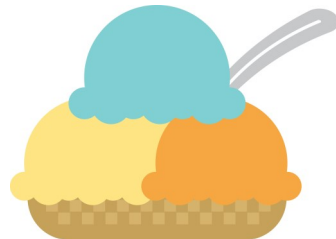
