

#### From the Pastor's Desk

By the time you read this article, you should have received a letter from Zion's Call Committee announcing that they have a candidate for your consideration for a call to be Zion's next pastor. This is an exciting time for Zion congregation as a new chapter in Zion's history is about to begin as you prepare to celebrate Zion's 150th anniversary next year.

Over the past couple of months, I have worked with the Call Committee that was elected by the congregation. Beginning with an initial meeting with Bishop Finegan, at which time they were given the name and profile of a candidate for call, they have worked diligently and devoted many hours in fulfillment of their task. They held an initial virtual interview with the candidate. Then they invited the candidate to come to Marinette for a weekend for a more in-depth interview. This gave the committee an opportunity to get to know the candidate on a personal basis over meals together and a tour of the church and community. They have had numerous meetings preparing for the interviews, assessing the interviews, contacting references, and planning for the candidate's previous and upcoming visits. I can rightfully say that I have never worked with a committee or group in the church that has gone about its task more enthusiastically, professionally and faithfully than the Call Committee you elected. Laura Rowe, as chairperson, has done an excellent job of communicating with the committee, leading meetings, assigning tasks, and communicating regularly with the candidate and with Bishop Finegan. All the committee members have provided valuable input and gone about their tasks with prayerful consideration as they have sought the guidance of the Holy Spirit to discern what God has in mind for Zion.

It now falls upon the congregation to seek the same prayerful discernment. To this end, the Call Committee has invited the candidate to return on October 19-20th. The potluck

supper on Saturday will give you an opportunity to meet the candidate in a casual and relaxed environment. The candidate will then lead worship and preach at the Sunday morning service. There will be a coffee hour following the service for further conversation.

The date of Sunday, November 3rd, has been set aside for a special congregation meeting at the conclusion of the worship service for the purpose of voting on extending a call. Another letter will be mailed to all Zion members with details about this meeting. The Call Committee is going about their task with due diligence, but the ultimate decision is in your hands. I encourage you to make every effort to attend the potluck supper and worship service on October 19 & 20th. I also solicit your prayers for the Holy Spirit's guidance in this matter, that God's will for Zion Lutheran Church be done. God has graced us all by calling us in baptism to be his body in the world, to be the church doing his work and witnessing to his love in Jesus Christ. God calls each one of us to use our gifts in his service and, as a congregation, to choose our leaders and those who will shepherd us as pastors. May God be glorified in all we do!

# **Letter from Bishop Finegan**



Dear People of the Northern Great Lakes Synod,

I have heard it said, "If nothing ever changed, there would be no butterflies." What I hear in this quote is the promise of better, the hope of beauty, and the surprise of blessing that can come from change.

Our world, our society, our climate, our culture, our Church - all are in the midst of change, transition, and maybe even transformation.

But we are not so keen on change. People like to sit in the same pew, go to the same place for coffee, sit in the same place at the dinner table, observe traditions and rituals that give order, structure, and meaning to our days. Sure, we might rearrange the furniture or put up new curtains, but these changes are of our own making. We choose the change and we can change it back if we want to. It's when changes are imposed upon us that we may balk, resist, or resent what another has decided or how the flow has shifted.

No one decided that the Church or culture should change, but it has. And because I believe the Holy Spirit knows how much we resist change, we, as the Church, are being pushed in a direction that we would not go in willingly but is God's will nevertheless. So here we are, and already I see the promise of better, the hope of beauty and unexpected blessing.

In July, 27 lay people who provide preaching in their own and neighboring congregations met for a Preaching Seminar. The goal was to further equip them for the ministry they are already doing - using their gifts in ways that perhaps would not happen if

there were enough pastors to go around. These gifted, spirited, and conscientious leaders invested their time and effort to learn more in order to do better. Efforts will continue to support and equip lay leaders and preachers for the work of ministry alongside pastors and administrative interims.

I see congregations becoming more collaborative, partnering together with neighboring congregations for ministry and education, supporting each other, becoming more aware of each other, learning from each other.

I see us becoming more mindful of the work of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Our classes on spirituality, prayer, and discernment offered through Lifelong Faith Formation continue to be well attended. I see a heightened tolerance for discomfort as people have the courage to engage in conversations around race, politics, gender issues, and more. More and more, people in our congregations are lowering their defenses to learn something new. Book studies, the Kaleidoscope Challenge, and study of ELCA social statements provide ongoing opportunities for deeper engagement and conversation concerning issues that do not have a sound bite answer.

I am proud of us for the innovation I see, the resilience, the adaptability, and the commitment to ministry and congregational life, even in the face of uncertainty and civil division.

Be aware that in our world, and in our congregations, anxiety can present as anger, negativity, and a desire to blame or demonize when really there is no one to blame. Change is simply happening. And our calling as disciples of Jesus is to respond in a way that is life giving, compassionate, and in alignment with

Jesus' command to love God and neighbor.

Change is afoot...even in the Synod office. Courtney Wehmeier, our Synod Office Administrator for the last year, was accepted into a graduate program in Leeds, England to pursue a degree in Marketing Analytics. Her last day was in July. Pastor Jim Duehring, our Assistant to the Bishop and Director for Evangelical Mission for the last seven years, has joined the ranks of the retired as of August 31. As of this writing, the search for new staff continues.

In the meantime, Betsy Koski, our Synod bookkeeper and fill-in-the-gap-gal, and myself will do our best to meet the demands of Synod ministry. And of course, in this staff transition, there is opportunity. Perhaps circumstances will necessitate inventing a new way of doing things. Perhaps we will be blessed with new staff that provide unique perspectives and a skill set that we didn't know we needed.

Whatever the future brings - in our country, in our world, in our congregations, in our synod, God is at work...in you and your community of faith. Together, we will strive to respond to change in a way that proclaims that we are disciples of Jesus and children of God, united in mission and planting seeds for future hope, beauty, and blessing.
