

#### From the Pastor's Desk

Following the Congregational Call Meeting on November 3, I received a note from Bishop Katherine Finegan thanking me for my service to Zion and my "patience" in waiting through the lengthy call process. She referred to November 3 as a "glory hallelujah" day. It was that, indeed. It was a day on which the members of Zion showed their true colors—participation (27 voting members were needed for a quorum; 80 were present!), faithfulness, unity of purpose and spirit, positivity, forward thinking, hopefulness, joy. All these qualities were evident in the spirit of the meeting and the resulting unanimous vote to extend a call to Rev. Amanda Kossow to serve as Zion's next pastor. With equal enthusiasm, Rev. Kossow accepted your call (see her letter of acceptance on the preceding page). Rev. Kossow will begin her ministry at Zion right after the first of the year. January 5 will be her first Sunday leading worship.

It has been a pleasure for me to work with the Call Committee chaired so capably by congregation president Laura Rowe. They served their fellow members exceedingly well. I appreciate the trust placed in them by the congregation and the affirmation of their work. I am grateful to Bishop Finegan for working diligently on Zion's behalf to secure a candidate for call. Mostly, I am grateful to the Holy Spirit for guiding my ministry among you and for leading Zion to this new beginning in your life as a Christian congregation. I will look forward to working with Pastor Amanda as a colleague in ministry in the future.

More immediately, I am looking forward to what we will share together in the remaining months of this year as you prepare to receive Pastor Amanda and begin your ministry together.

November 24 will be Christ the King Sunday. We end the church year on a high note by celebrating the good news that Jesus Christ, who died for our salvation and rose victorious over sin and death that we may have eternal life, now lives ....continued

What brings you to your knees?

Babies get on their knees when learning to crawl, and I remember continuing to do so as a small child when I would makebelieve that I was a horse and allow my younger brothers to ride upon my back.

I remember getting on my knees to peek under beds and other low-to-the-ground spaces while playing hide-and-seek.

I can remember having fallen to my knees more times than I can count while learning to skate and ski – plenty of times on my backside too!

I can remember being on my knees to pull weeds and plant flowers in gardens.

I can remember being on my knees, smashing them to the ground, after tripping down the stairs and turning both black and blue.

I can remember being on my knees in fervent prayer when life felt really hard, when my world and the world of those I loved felt like it might be ending.

I can remember kneeling at the communion rail to receive the holy supper on many occasions.

This past Christmas, the women's barbershop quartet in which I sing sang a version of "O Holy Night," one of my favorite Christmas songs. I am particularly drawn to the lyrics which state, "Fall on your knees. O hear the angel voices. O night divine. O night when Christ was born."

The presence of God has come into the world, born as a baby laid in a humble manger, announced by a heavenly host filling the skies over the fields where the shepherds' tended flocks of sheep. What an astonishing, awestriking sight and experience it must have been, so much so that I can imagine, as does the author of the song, falling to one's knees, humbled by the sight and glory of it all.

Has God ever brought you to your knees? What was your experience like? What did God reveal to you in that moment?

**Prayer:** O God, humble our hearts before you. Teach us to fall upon our knees and revere all that you are and all that you do with awe. Amen.

# **Letter from Bishop Finegan**



So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith."

-Galatians 6:9-10

Dear People of the Northern Great Lakes Synod,

I remember being reluctant to play "Monopoly" with my brothers I had learned that the game quickly became a source of conflict, especially when my competitive siblings did not lose, or win, wit grace. The game would often be fraught with tension and anxiety and end with tears, yelling, and maybe even a punch or two thrown in for good measure. Maybe it only happened once, but I learned not to play that game.

Despite the occasional violence and fighting over a board game, even as children we all knew, without having the language to say so, that our relationship as a family was always the priority. We were not allowed to be angry for long. Often, whatever lingering ill will there was dissipated after a snack, a nap, or shifting to another game that was far more fun.

This priority of relationship over the power of disagreement has continued into our adult life. We do not agree on everything. We have differing views and perspectives...on money, parenting, what shows are worth watching, what sports teams to support, and most markedly of late - politics. While this grieves me, it does not threaten the love I have for my siblings. I know that whoever wins the presidential election, the occupant of the oval office will not stop me from loving my siblings and holding that relationship as a priority.

The same goes for my neighbors and friends. The relationship is the priority, not any disagreement concerning our political opinions or affiliations.

## **Letter from Bishop Finegan**

Granted, the relationship can be strained by such disagreements. We can feel sad that people we know and love can have different convictions. When we feel strongly, there is a real challenge as to how to interact, converse, and continue the focus on the relationship and the common ground we do share.

But when the relationship is the priority, the rest feels less important, even as it continues to be important.

I am hopeful that the same can be true of our families of faith. It is worth noting that our congregations continue to be one of the few places in society that continues to hold and defend space to disagree, even as we are unified in our desire and our efforts to serve the work of Christ. Without taking a poll, I would guess that each and every one of our congregations reflects the general division of our nation into the separate groups of Republicans, Democrats, Independents, non-voters, etc. And yet, we continue to gather and be in proximity to each other. As the body of Christ, we worship together, share coffee fellowship, partner in ministry, and get the work of Christ done. In our families of faith, we are reminded again and again how our relationship with a loving God shapes who we are and how we are with our siblings in Christ and community neighbors, even and especially with those with whom we disagree. This is no small thing.

As the election results become apparent, as there may be discord and even violence, as some may not win, or lose, with grace, I put my trust in the power of Christ to bind us together in love. Relationship is the priority. Let us work for the good of all... together, no matter how we have voted or who occupies the oval office. Let us not grow weary in doing what is right, following Jesus our Lord and Savior every step of the way.
